Read Matthew 5:14-16. What echoes of Jesus' teaching do you hear in Peter's urging (2:12)?

Under what conditions or circumstances does Peter call us to live lives characterized by good deeds?

What wrong assumptions or accusations do unbelievers in our culture make toward Christ-followers?

What would it look like in the context of the coronavirus for us to pray and labor for the good of our neighbors?
