What were the high places and Asherah poles? See a Bible dictionary.

What evil influences draw us away from devotion to the Lord? What needs to be removed from our lives?

What did Jehoshaphat do throughout all of Judah (17:7-9)?

Why is it important for all of God's people to know and understand God's word?

How can the local church help God's people to know and understand God's word? Share your ideas with leadership.

What could you do to help another person know and understand God's word?

How did the people of Judah and surrounding nations respond to Jehoshaphat's reign (17:5, 10-11)?

Live It!

Increase Your Devotion to the Ways of the Lord Examine your choices.

Do your choices reflect a whole-hearted devotion to God or to your own self-interest?

- In your friendships
- In your marriage
- In the use of your time
- In the use of your resources

Increase Your Devotion to the Worship of God

- What are your substitutes?
- Where do you seek joy and satisfaction?
- What is your next step in restoring the worship of God?

Increase Your Devotion to the Word of God

- What time will you set aside to read the Bible this week?
- Who will you ask to help you read and understand the Scriptures?
- Where does God want you to teach His word?
