What does Paul say about the obedience of the Philippian believers (2:12)?

How does our obedience change if our (parent, coach, boss) is present or absent? Who is always present?

What are believers to work out, that is accomplish by carrying out together (2:12-12)?

What does it mean "to work out your salvation with fear and trembling" (See Exodus 20:18-21 and Hebrews 12:23-29)?

How does God help churches fulfill their saving purpose (2:12-13)?

What specific areas of concern does Paul have (2:14-16)? What grumbling and complaining are believers guilty of today?

What was hindering the witness of the Philippian believers? What would it take for them to shine "like stars" in their world (1:9-11, 27; 2:1-5)?

What did Paul desire for the Philippian believers (2:17-18)?
